

Dear Friends,

Today our parish participates in the ancient rite of the Corpus Christi Procession. Like any procession, the primary liturgical image is the entrance of God's people into paradise. Our parish processes around the Church, the living sacrament of our faith, welcoming all those who gaze upon the Sacred Host to come and adore Him. The traditional canopy carried over the Monstrance conveys the image of the Tent that housed God's presence during the People's journey to the Promised Land. During the procession we sing and pray the litanies as a sign of our total surrender to the Will of God.

Please join us and give praise and adoration to the Eucharist, the source and summit of our lives!

This is a passage from a very good book I am reading called, Meditations before Mass, by Romano Guardini, I'd like to share with you in the hopes that this meditation will help you:

"We do not come to church to "attend the service," which usually means as a spectator, but in order, along with the priest, to serve God. Everything we do: our entering, being present, our kneeling and sitting and standing, our reception of the Sacred Nourishment, should be of divine service. This is when all we do "overflows" from the awareness of a collected heart and the mind's attentiveness."

Such composure is all the more necessary since liturgical action is devoid of what otherwise enforces attention: namely utility. When I seat myself at my desk and pick up a manuscript, my attention naturally passes to it; when I do a Job in my worship, I unconsciously pull myself together, otherwise it will miscarry. Everywhere some utilitarian "purpose" to be accomplished binds my attention. In the Mass there are no such purposes. The believer simply steps into the presence of God and remains there for Him. The liturgy is a thing of exalted 'purposelessness," but it is filled with the sense of sacred serving, and over it reigns the sublimity of God. Here, composure means everything. Hence it must be willed and practiced. Otherwise, our service grows dull, indolent, and careless -an insult to His divine Majesty."

MDP SHORE UP THE FUTURE

As of June 5, 2023, we have received \$202,595.50 in donations from 229 families for our 2020 Year 3 Challenge – renovations to the Parish Offices and creation of our Family and Youth Center. To date, we have spent \$172,745.40 on renovations including an enlarged office for the Director of Religious Education, several enlarged rooms for youth gatherings, new HVAC throughout both sides of the first floor of the building, upgraded electrical throughout the building, improvements to the front meeting room, and new carpeting and painting throughout much of the areas. IN OUR PARISH

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ROTT

The feast of Corpus Christi was proposed by Thomas Aquinas to Pope Urban IV, in order to create a feast focused solely on the Holy Eucharist, emphasizing the reality of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. A Eucharistic miracle in Bolesna, Italy in 1263 where a consecrated host began to bleed on a corporal had a significant influence on instituting this feast day. Jesus said in John 6, "I am the living bread that came down out of heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread also which I will give for the life of the world is My flesh... Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in yourselves. He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For My flesh is true food, and My blood is true drink."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the Eucharist as the "source and summit" of Christian life. Pope Benedict said "without the Eucharist, the Church simply does not exist." The question on our hearts should always be how I make attending weekend Mass the most important event that I will experience during the entire week, not how to avoid attending Mass.

As Catholics we are obligated to go to Mass on Sunday, not as a punishment, but because it is the day that Jesus rose from the dead, the scriptures tell us to keep the Lord's Day holy, and Jesus commanded us as referenced above. Paragraph 2181 of the Catechism states:

"The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin."

I have noticed that recently, many faith-filled people are confused about the obligation due to the pandemic and the accessibility of watching the liturgy online or on television. Here are a few helpful points:

- We are not permitted to watch Mass through tv/ online/livestream as a replacement for attending Sunday Mass. These tools are good for people that cannot attend Mass for a serious reason or if someone enjoys a liturgy or a preacher at a place that they cannot attend but they must attend Sunday Mass in addition to these resources.

- If someone cannot attend Sunday Mass due to a serious reason, there is no obligation to watch Mass on tv/ online/livestream. The Church encourages people to watch Mass if they have a serious reason where they cannot attend, but there is no requirement.

- Feel free to encourage people that you know to watch a liturgy that may be beneficial as a hopeful "foot in the door" to coming or returning to Church.
